

**The Craven Hall Historical Society Announces Partnerships With  
Libertas Consulting, Low Voltage Nation  
Partnership to Provide High Speed Internet Access Across 18th Century Craven Hall  
and Adjacent John Fitch Steamboat Museum**

Craven Hall Historical Society, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization dedicated to the preservation and education of local history, has announced it has partnered with Low Voltage Nation in order to bring the latest in technology to historic Craven Hall and John Fitch Steamboat Museum. The partnership, the first of its kind for Low Voltage Nation, will provide the Craven Hall Historical Society with high speed internet access throughout both Craven Hall museum and adjacent John Fitch Steamboat Museum. The announcement comes just two months after the completion of an addition to the John Fitch Steamboat Museum. With internet access now at its fingertips, the Craven Hall Historical Society hopes to offer not only free wireless internet to visitors and those seeking an internet-capable meeting space, but also enhance its museum exhibits with state-of-the-art technology and new curatorial displays.

The John Fitch Steamboat Museum addition, paid for through a gracious donation made by museum vice president, Harding Lindhult, will provide other organizations and businesses in the surrounding community with a 30+ person conference space which includes a brand new climate control system and a 70" Smart television for presentations. However, the Board of Directors had previously concluded that it would not be able to make such use of the space without internet access. Upon further investigation, it was determined that the addition of internet capabilities to both Craven Hall and the John Fitch Steamboat Museum could easily surpass \$30,000, and with donations at a near standstill due to the pandemic, the Society was unsure of how to raise the necessary funds.

Erik Fleischer, President of the Craven Hall Historical Society and John Fitch Steamboat Museum, had met Ray Cline, President of Libertas Consulting and Director of Low Voltage Nation, at a Greater BucksMont Chamber of Commerce scholarship meeting held at Craven Hall. Both organizations are board members of the Chamber. Upon further discussion, Mr. Cline realized his interest in preserving local history and contacted Mr. Fleischer regarding his idea to help install and provide internet access to the historic building and museum at no cost to the Society. Through a compelling pitch to members of Low Voltage Nation, the public, and a successful donation drive, Libertas Consulting was able to rally business owners from across the country to assist with this monumental project. Businesses from Tennessee, Colorado, and New Jersey joined the effort, and to date, more than \$27,500 worth of supplies and materials were donated, including switches, conduits, wireless access points, wiring, and more helping to make this important modernization project possible. The donated amount also includes one year of free internet access for the Historical Society.
